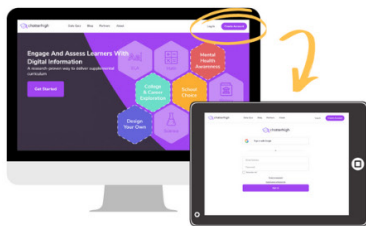
CHATTER HIGH

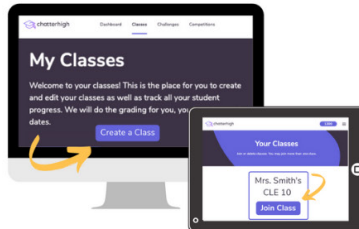

NB ChatterHigh Competition How to Participate (for Teachers)



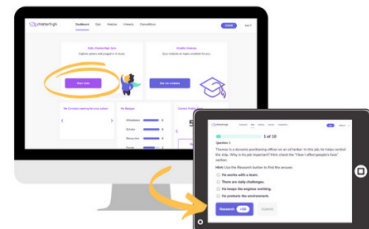

LMI IN SCHOOL PRESENTATIONS

Each year we partner with the Department of Post- Secondary Education, Training and Labour (PETL) to provide sessions on up-to-date New Brunswick Labour Market Information (LMI) for 9/10 Personal Development and Career Planning (PDCP) classrooms. Research shows that engaging students in finding their purpose (which includes having a look at LMI) is associated with many educational benefits including:

- improves academic achievement
- increases student engagement and motivation
- bolsters well-being/mental health and satisfaction in life
- facilitates the development of global competencies
- prepares students for the workplaces of the future (skills economy)

In addition to working with PDCP classrooms, the presenters are willing to work with educators in the following formats:

- staff meetings
- half-day professional learning for staff
- experiential teachers (Coop 120, Career Exploration 110, Essential Skills, etc.)
