

# GRADE 12 CAREER LIFE PLAN

A Career Life Plan is a comprehensive education, career and life plan that documents your unique learning needs, interests, aspirations, and accomplishments.

In order to graduate, each student will be expected to showcase evidence (preferably in a myBlueprint Portfolio) in the following areas:

### THINKING ABOUT POTENTIAL CAREER PATHWAYS:

- $\hfill\square$  Create a goal to show preparation for life beyond high school
- $\square$  Develop an action plan to work towards a career pathway
- $\hfill\square$  Create a financial plan that considers life beyond high school

### **EXPLORING POTENTIAL CAREER PATHWAYS**:

- □ Completion of the five assessments in myBlueprint include Learning Styles, Personality, Interest Survey, Knowledge, and Motivation
- $\Box$  Identify two or more career life pathways of interest
- □ Identify post-secondary pathways connected to a career life plan

### **EXPERIENCING POTENTIAL CAREER PATHWAYS:**

- $\Box$  Develop resume writing skills
- $\hfill\square$  Develop cover letter writing skills
- □ Engage in an interview opportunity
- $\hfill\square$  Participate in authentic career connected experiential learning opportunity
- □ Engage in a student led conference of the completed career life plan



# THINKING

Create a personal Goal in myBlueprint called "Preparing for Next Year" and create a broken-down Task list as to how you will prepare for your next year. Add your action plan to your portfolio.



### Include the following reflection:

What do you need to do? What may be some unexpected challenges you may experience? How will you adjust and/or overcome these challenges?

Visit the Money section of myBlueprint and refine your financial budget related to your career/life plan. Add your updated budget to your portfolio.



## Include the following reflection:

What if any adjustments do you need to make to your budget? How will you overcome financial challenges should they arise? How will this impact your planning?

# **EXPLORING**

Add a Journal Box to your portfolio and explain your current professional network.



### Include the following reflection:

Who can you access for support? Who can be a reference for you? Who are your career/life plan contacts? What have you learned about the importance of networking relationships?

- Search the occupations listed in the Work section of myBlueprint and favourite at least one new profession of interest.
- Add your favourited occupation(s) to your Career Life Plan portfolio.



### Include the following reflection:

How would you achieve this career? How would you prepare for potential challenges?

Search the Post-Secondary section of myBlueprint and favourite at least one new pathway of interest.



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Pro Tip: Use the Compare feature to review your favourite occupations and post-secondary programs within myBlueprint

Add your favourited post-secondary pathway(s) of interest to your portfolio.



### Include the following reflection:

Explain your pathway choices and how they will help you achieve your career/life plan.

# **EXPERIENCING**

Go to the Work section of myBlueprint and update your Resume. Add two new achievements. Ensure your Resume includes at least 5 skills and abilities, 2 areas of interest, 2 extra-curricular activities, an objective, and any experiential activities (i.e., volunteering, paid work, site visits, virtual opportunities, conversations or workintegrated learning experiences). Add your Resume to your portfolio.



Include the following reflection:

How has your Resume changed? How have you grown? What will be your plan for continued updates?





Pro Tip: Use Tags (e.g., "grade 12") in your myBlueprint Portfolio to organize your content by the year you added it!



 Add a Journal Box to your portfolio and share details about a career-connected experiential learning / realworld opportunity you have had in an area of interest.
(Volunteering, part-time job, Co-op, post-secondary visits, job site visits, work-integrated learning, Centres of Excellence, etc.,)



### Include the following reflection:

How does this experience help inform your career/life plan?

- Use the Slideshow mode in the top right corner of your portfolio to present your Career Life Plan.
- Add a Journal Box to your portfolio and reflect on your experience from the Career Life Plan presentation.



Include the following reflection: Complete a self-assessment of your portfolio and presentation. Reflect on your career/life portfolio and all you have learned about yourself. What are you most proud of?
