

Career Life Plan - FAQs

1. Do students need to use myBlueprint to complete the Career Life Plan?
 - a. No, it is not required for students to use myBlueprint to complete their Career Life Plan. However, most schools have decided to go the route of using myBlueprint as it allows students to easily store their completed work over grades 9-12, and many of the tasks are already embedded within the tool.
2. Do tasks save once they have been completed in myBlueprint?
 - a. Yes. Once students save tasks in their Career Life Plan portfolio, the tasks will stay there.
3. Why are some students not showing as “100%” complete in myBlueprint even though I had confirmed they completed all Career Life Plan tasks?
 - a. myBlueprint task-completion data reflects only activities completed using my Blueprint’s built-in features. Some students may complete required Career Life Plan components (e.g., resumes or financial plans) outside the platform, with evidence stored in their Career Life Plan digital portfolio.
4. Are there rubrics for the tasks?
 - a. No – there is a minimum checklist of requirements for each learner to complete, but the Career Life Plan is flexible in its representation. Schools have the autonomy to determine how to best demonstrate achievement of these requirements based on their unique contexts, strengths, and learner needs.
5. What about students who require additional support or are newcomers?
 - a. Schools should adapt expectations and supports as needed. This may include differentiated instruction, alternative formats, or additional guidance to ensure all students can successfully complete their Career Life Plan.
6. Is the Career Life Plan graded? On transcript?
 - a. This depends on the school. Some schools assess completion or effort, while others may incorporate it into course expectations or use it for feedback only.
7. How often should students update their Career Life Plan?
 - a. Students should revisit and update their plan regularly, ideally each year, as their interests, goals, and experiences evolve.
8. Can students include experiences outside of school? For example, community service?
 - a. Yes. Activities like part-time sports, and community involvement are all valuable and encouraged - goal setting etc. are vital for checklists.
